## Habits of Mind

## Habits of Mind is a unified measure of the behaviors and traits associated with academic success. These learning behaviors are seen as the foundation for lifelong learning.



## Construct Items

- Ask questions in class
- Support your opinions with a logical argument
- Seek solutions to problems and explain them to others
- Revise your papers to improve your writing
- Evaluate the quality or reliability of information you received
- Take a risk because you felt you had more to gain
- Seek alternative solutions to a problem
- Look up scientific research articles and resources
- Explore topics on your own, even though it was not required for a class
- Seek feedback on your academic work
- Accept mistakes as part of the learning process
- Integrate skills and knowledge from difference sources and experiences


## Pluralistic Orientation

Pluralistic Orientation is a unified measure of skills and dispositions appropriate for living and working in a diverse society.


## Academic Self-Concept

Self-awareness and confidence in academic environments help students learn by encouraging their intellectual inquiry. Academic Self-Concept is a unified measure of students' beliefs about their abilities and confidence in academic environments.
