Joint Option!

- Three options to choose: (1) General studies Option: Earn up to 6 semester credits in general studies of economics, history, political science, psychology, or world literature; (2) Chinese Language and Culture option: earn 9 credits in Chinese language and culture; or (3) Sign up for both: joint option students eligible for the Asia Certificate issued by the USG Asia Council or for the Asian Studies minor at KSU
- Study in cities of Zhengzhou and Shanghai close to many historical and cultural sites
- Visit landmark cities Beijing, Xi'an, Zhengzhou, Luoyang, Shaolin, Suzhou, Nanjing, and Shanghai
- Faculty from the University System of Georgia accompanying as you study and experience the world's oldest civilization
- All courses combine classroom instruction with field trips and weekend excursions
- Additional cultural enrichment programs in martial arts, Tai-Chi, dances, etc. are also available.
- The language program offers multi-level classes; no background in the language required.
- The language immersion program moves students quickly into a higher level of proficiency in Chinese.

Joint Option Duration and Costs:

4-weeks General Studies - **\$3,650.00** includes: roundtrip airfare, lodging and most meals, class field trips, weekend excursions, most ground transportation, visa application. Not include tuition.

4-weeks Chinese Language - **\$1,690.00** (since joint option students will have had a trip to Beijing before joining the language program, the requirement for the cultural trip to Beijing is waived) includes: lodging and some meals, class field trips, and weekend excursions. Not include tuition.
