COMPASS & CAAP TESTING AT DSC

During the 1999-2000 academic year, the College introduced the Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency (CAAP), an external, nationally normed assessment tool as part of its general education assessment and institutional effectiveness programs. The CAAP assesses foundational academic skills in the areas of writing, reading, mathematics, science reasoning and critical thinking. Working with ACT's Post Secondary Services Branch, the Institutional Research office coordinated and administered tests to freshmen for the first time in the summer of 1999. In addition to documenting levels of proficiency and providing evidence of acceptable levels of student academic skills in the general education core areas, CAAP is helpful to the College in determining how its students as a group compare with students at the same levels attending similar colleges across the nation. The College had initially planned to use the CAAP as both a pretest and posttest assessment tool.

However, during the 2000-2001 academic year the College began using ACT's Computer-Adaptive Placement Assessment and Support System (COMPASS) test as an academic assessment and diagnostic tool. All entering freshmen and new students admitted to the College will take the COMPASS test, which comprises Pre-Algebra, Algebra, Reading, and English. Only off-campus mini-certificate and transfer students with more than 30 hours of academic credit course are exempted.

Because of the compatibility of the COMPASS and CAAP tests, the College administration decided to use the COMPASS as a pretest and the CAAP as a posttest. The first CAAP posttest was administered in the spring of 2001. Together, both the COMPASS and CAAP will be given to freshmen and graduates so that before/after benchmarks can be established. This entering freshmen/graduate cycle will be repeated annually. This action directly supports Core Purpose II of the College's mission statement and completes a major step in the implementation of comprehensive institutional effectiveness measures.

In the Spring of 2002, the College mandated that all graduates in the Transfer (Associate of Arts & Associate of Science), Associate of Applied Science (Technical Education programs), and Associate of Nursing (ASN) programs must take the CAAP as a post-test as part of their graduation requirements beginning with the Spring 2002 graduates.

**DIVISION OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION
ETS EXAM SCORE SUMMARY**

Beginning Fall 2000 the Division of Business Administration has strongly encouraged students to take the ETS exam. Initially, students took the exam at the time they begin taking upper division courses and then again at graduation. Participation was voluntary. In the past few years students have taken the exam during their last semester prior to graduation. Scores have continually improved. In Spring 2004 the institutional mean for DSC was at the 80th percentile, compared to 469 institutions nationwide. In Spring 2005 the institutional mean was at the 90th percentile.
