This change will merge what use to be two separate processes for regular student misconduct and student sexual misconduct. This change will merge them into one adjudication process. They will be investigated separately, but they will be adjudicated together.

We want Campus Outreach to become an open member organization, which will allow for all participants to feel welcomed into our meetings and our group as a whole. We are a Presbyterian based group, but we do not want any of the participants to feel as if they have to be of the same religion, we welcome anyone who is willing to learn and grow with us. We are requesting funding, which would cover conferences we would like to attend, advertising so we can get students and others that are interesting information, as well as money for snacks during our meetings. The amount we are asking for is \$200.

Matthew Presley, member of the Chemist Society I believe that we should be giving them less money, due to the fact that this will be a new RSO. They should prove to us that they will be using all of the money in a proper way. I recommend that we give them \$150 instead of the \$200.

Kellsea Jenkins, Senator for the School of Education, if we do not give them money then they will not be able to grow. At the end of the day they are going to need funding regardless, we should give them the full \$200. They have a plan on what they want to us it for, that already helps show that they will use the funds in a positive way.

This committee will investigate referrals, link at-risk individuals with campus and community resources for support, develop protocols for the protection and safety of the campus community, and educate the campus community on topics relevant to responding to incidents of a critical nature. Individuals working on the CARE Team are comprised of Dean of Students, Disability Support, Counseling, Conduct, Residential Life, Public Safety, and Faculty Representation – Other Campus Partners are called on an “as needed” basis.

D. Request for Funding

Before we begin the request for funding presentations, I would like to speak on behalf of the Budget and Fee committee. We would like all of you to know that we took everything into account with our suggestions. We looked at what conferences had students presenting, the amount of students attending, benefits these conferences will bring for students, but also the school, and finally we wanted all of the out of pocket cost to be somewhat in the same range.
