Application may be made after successful completion of 24 credit hours from the English Major Curriculum area; the teacher candidate must successfully pass both sections of the English GACE® Content Exams (www.mypsc.gapsc.org and www.gace.ets.org). 			

ENGL 3010 must be taken in the student's first semester as English major; may be taken as a co-requisite with two other upper-division English courses in the student's first semester as an English major.

Students must be accepted to the Education Program prior to taking upper-division (3000-4000) education courses.

Students must earn a C or above in all upper-division courses, regardless of discipline.
