# The History and Meaning of Academic Regalia

The origins of academic attire date back to the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> centuries in ancient monasteries in Europe where universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was the dress of a cleric, as most medieval scholars of the day had taken at least minor orders or made certain religious vows. The long gowns and hoods that were worn by these scholars were needed to help provide warmth in unheated buildings.

By the second half of the 14<sup>th</sup> century in England, the statutes of certain colleges prescribed the wearing of a long gown. During Henry VIII's day, Oxford and Cambridge began prescribing a definite academic dress for scholars, which included the long black gown. This dress code evolved to include the assignment of colors on the hoods to signify certain academic disciplines, which became standardized only in the United States in the late 19<sup>th</sup> century. Red, for example, was assigned to theology, as red was one of the traditional colors of the church. Green, the color of medieval herbs, was adopted for medicine, while golden yellow, representing the wealth which scientific research has produced, was assigned to the sciences.

Today, gowns recommended for use in U.S. colleges and universities have the following characteristics: the bachelor's degree gown has pointed sleeves; the master's degree gown has oblong sleeves; and the doctor's degree gown has bell-shaped sleeves. Gowns for the bachelor's or master's degrees are untrimmed, while doctor's degree gowns are trimmed in velvet along the front of the gown and on the sleeves.

The hoods are lined in the colors of the college or university conferring the degree, and the color of the facing denotes the academic discipline.

The colors associated with the different disciplines are as follows:

Arts, Letters and Humanities, white; Music, pink; Business, drab; Nursing, apricot; Economics, copper; Speech, silver gray; Education, light blue; Philosophy, dark blue; Engineering, orange; Physical Education, sage green; Fine Arts, brown; Public Administration, peacock blue; Journalism, crimson; Public Health, salmon pink; Law, purple; Science, golden yellow; Library Science, lemon; Social Work, citron.

#### The Academic Mace

The tradition of the mace can be dated to medieval kings, whose bodyguards would use a mace as an element of protection. It came to symbolize strength and authority. Gradually, universities adopted the use of a mace to show the right of academic institutions to grant degrees to graduates. The Dalton State College mace features a walnut shaft and sterling silver medallions bearing the College seal.

#### **Graduate Distinctions**

A silver cord signifies graduation with honors and a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher.

The purple and green honors cord signifies membership in Kappa Delta Pi, the International Honor Society in Education.

A gold and green honors cord signifies membership in Beta Gamma Sigma, the international honor society serving business programs accredited by AACSB International–the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business.

A pewter medallion indicates membership in Phi Alpha, a national social work honor society.

A silver medallion signifies the candidate is an Honors Program Graduate.

A green and red honor cord signifies membership in Beta Beta (Tri-Beta), the national honor society for biology students.

A red and blue cord with mixed tassel indicates membership in Phi Alpha Theta, the national history honor society.

A red, white, and blue honor cord signifies that the graduate is a current or former member of the United States armed forces.

A silver cord indicates membership in Psi Chi a national psychology honor society.

A light blue cord signifies an International Endorsement.

A blue and gold honor cord signifies membership in the American Chemistry Honor Society, the national honor society for chemistry majors.

A rich cardinal red and black double strand honor cords with tassels represents participation in Sigma Tau Delta, the National English Society.

A purple, mint green and gold cord signifies membership in Kappa Delta Pi, the national honor society for teacher educators.

# About Dalton State College

Dalton State serves nearly 5,000 students at its campuses in Dalton and Ellijay and online. Dalton State attracts students from 35 countries and 26 states.

The College was chartered as Dalton Junior College in July 1963 and opened in September 1967. It offered programs designed to provide the first two years of college work for students preparing to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. The addition of a technical division in 1976 enabled the school to serve students wishing to develop work skills at the certificate or associate degree level. In 1987, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia removed the word "Junior" from the college's name, and it became Dalton College.

In 1998, the University System of Georgia authorized Dalton College to offer bachelor's degrees, and it became Dalton State College. The first bachelor's programs began that year, in business and technology. Today, Dalton State College offers 24 bachelor's degrees and seven associate degrees in an array of high-demand professions, including business, education, health professions, criminal justice, and STEM disciplines.

Dalton State College serves a diverse student population seeking challenging academics and rich collegiate experiences. About 50% of Dalton State's students are the first in their families to attend college, and Dalton State is Georgia's first Hispanic-Serving Institution.

Dalton State was ranked number one in the nation for Student Experience in The Wall Street Journal/College Pulse 2024 Best Colleges in the U.S. rankings, based on student and alumni survey data relative to campus facilities, community and social life, and diversity on campus.

Dalton State's campus includes 12 academic buildings and facilities. Following the completion of two planned renovations this year, nearly all buildings and facilities on campus will have been renovated or newly constructed within the past decade.

Dalton State faculty have been honored four times with the prestigious Regents' Award for Excellence in Teaching by the University System of Georgia Foundation: Dr. Marilyn M. Helms, Professor of Management, in 2007; Dr. Christy Price, Professor of Psychology, in 2009; Dr. Marina Smitherman, Professor of Biology, in 2020; and Dr. Kimberly Hays, Associate Professor of Biology, in 2021.

### Honorary Doctorate Recipients, Mr. Robert E. "Bob" Shaw and Mrs. Dorothy "Dottie" S. Boring Shaw

Dalton State College, on behalf of the University System of Georgia Board of Regents, will award Honorary Doctor of Business Administration degrees to Mr. Robert E. "Bob" Shaw and Mrs. Dorothy "Dottie" S. Boring Shaw during the College's spring 2024 commencement exercises.

Mr. Robert E. "Bob" Shaw has been a key Dalton State supporter since the College opened in 1967, and he publicly promotes the College as one of the primary economic drivers of Northwest Georgia.

After graduating from Dalton High School, Mr. Shaw attended the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. He began his career in the flooring industry as a teenager driving a truck for his father at Star Dye Company, and, in 1958, following his father's death, he retooled the company into Star Finishing with his brother, J.C. "Bud" Shaw.

He was co-founder and chief executive officer of Shaw Industries Inc. for 48 years and retired in 2006. A few years later, he established Engineered Floors LLC. Today, Engineered Floors operates more than 10 major facilities and employs nearly 5,000 associates.

Through his corporate and personal philanthropy, his extraordinary vision of what our community can and will become, and his employment of hundreds of Dalton State graduates over the years, Mr. Shaw's friendship to the institution has propelled us every time we sought to make a leap forward. He was an early trustee of the Dalton Junior College Foundation, and Shaw Industries made its first gift to the College in 1972.

The company was an early and prominent supporter of the College's first bachelor's degrees in the late 1990s, and it has given generously over several decades for a wide array of projects across campus. In addition to his corporate philanthropy, Mr. Shaw's personal investments of time, talent, and treasure have helped to sustain Dalton State's growth to serve Northwest Georgia and beyond.

Dottie Boring Shaw attended East Mississippi Junior College and earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Education from Mississippi State University, a master's degree in business education from Mississippi State University, and an Education Specialist degree in Community College Teaching with concentration in Accounting from Auburn University. She taught accounting at Dalton Junior College from 1970 to 1981. She and her late husband, Kenneth E. Boring, endowed a scholarship in 2000 to support Dalton State's growth and encourage students seeking careers in the health professions. She has continued to support that endowed scholarship fund, and, in 2020, she helped endow and equip the College's new engineering technology lab. In 2009, one of her former students, citing Mrs. Shaw's formative influence, created an endowed award for outstanding teaching in Dalton State's Wright School of Business.

The Shaws' enduring friendship to Dalton State College and our students across six decades have enriched the institution beyond measure, and we are pleased to present them with this well-deserved honor.

# Commissioner John F. King, Georgia Department of Insurance and Safety Fire

John F. King was sworn in as Georgia's Insurance and Safety Fire Commissioner by Governor Brian Kemp on July 1, 2019, becoming the first Hispanic statewide official in state history. He was elected to a full four-year term on November 8, 2022.

Before becoming Commissioner, King spent his career in law enforcement, beginning as an Atlanta police officer in 1985 and culminating as Chief of Police for the City of Doraville. While at the Atlanta Police Department, he worked various assignments including Red Dog, Organized Crime/Intelligence, and received the Chief's Blue Star in 1987 for being injured in the line of duty as a result of a criminal attack with a firearm. His career also includes assignments to both FBI and DEA as a Task Force Agent.

A native of Mexico, King made a meaningful impact by building bridges among Doraville's diverse populations and implementing youth education and crime-prevention programs in his role as Chief of Police. Recognizing the international composition of Doraville's community, King made it a priority to hire bilingual police officers, place multiple languages on police cars, and ensure effective translators and public defenders were employed at the City Courthouse. Commissioner King's initiatives include Anti-Gang education programs for elementary school students and parents. He worked with the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce to establish an education program for prospective small business entrepreneurs and worked with state, county, and local leaders to implement a safety and speed reduction program targeted to Buford Highway to reduce the number of pedestrian fatalities. Commissioner King is also a member of Leadership DeKalb.

In addition to his former roles in the Atlanta and Doraville Police Departments, King retired as a Major General in the U.S. Army following his final assignment to NORAD and U.S. Northern Command. King was the former Commander of the 48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team and has deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina, Iraq, Afghanistan, and Africa. He served as the Military Advisor to the Deputy Minister of Interior for Security for Afghanistan, who oversaw an agency of over 96,000 police officers.

While serving on Active Duty and the National Guard, King earned numerous awards for his achievements. King received the Combat Action Badge for his service in Iraq and the Combat Infantry Badge for service in Afghanistan. Other awards and decorations include Legion of Merit, Bronze Star (2) Award, Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Meritorious Unit Award, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, El Salvador Gold Medal for Achievement, and the Afghanistan Barial 2nd Degree Medal. King received his Bachelor's of Arts degree in criminal justice and public administration from Brenau University and a Master's Degree in Strategic Studies from the U.S. Army War College. He graduated from Harvard University Senior Executives in National Security and Syracuse University National Security Decision Making Course. Commissioner King was a graduate of class #229 in the FBI National Academy in Quantico, VA, and also a graduate of the Georgia International Law Enforcement Exchange program to Israel (GILEE).

Commissioner King is also fluent in Spanish.
