

Program Pathway – Radiologic Technology

This map is a term-by-term sample course schedule. Highlighted courses have been identified as "key courses." It is strongly advised that students make every effort to pass these courses on the first attempt with a "C" or higher in order to be successful in this program. The milestones listed below each year are designed to keep you on course to graduate in four years. Missing milestones could prevent you from being eligible for a particular program or could result in a delay in graduation. The Program Pathway serves as a general guideline to help you build a full schedule each term.

If a student takes Biology 2251K and withdraws or earns below a "C", the student cannot retake the course without taking Biology 1107 first. ** Sciences and Algebra courses shall have been taken within five years of admission, readmission, or transfer into the program, or they shall be repeated. Students are ineligible to enter the rad tech program if unable to pass any of the required biological science courses or College Algebra after two attempts. Students must also comply with all Radiologic Technology Program policies and Dalton State College policies.

***If BIOL 2251K & BIOL 2252K are not taken at DSC, or other USG college, they most likely will not be accepted. The options for remediation are DSC credit by exam (if failed exam, course must be retaken at DSC) or retaking the courses at DSC. Also, allied health terminology is a 3-hour course at DSC. Those wishing to transfer their 2-hour course (at DSC it is a 3-hour course) can remediate at DSC with credit by exam (if failed exam, course must be retaken at DSC).
